The Ventura Keys Association is governed by a 12-member Board of Directors. Each member is elected for a two-year term of office. Every year at the Association's general meeting in January six board members are elected by the Keys Association members present. This year's annual meeting will again be held in the Community Room of Avco Savings and Loan Association, 250 South Mills Road, Ventura on Friday, January 29, 1971, at 8 p.m.

The officers of the Association are also elected by the entire membership at the January meeting. These officers are chosen from the 12 elected board members. This year the Board of Directors has nominated 7 nominees for consideration by the general membership to fill the six available positions.

These include one incumbent, **BOB CORDY**, Director, Construction Systems Division of Ocean Engineering Department, Naval Civil Engineering Laboratory, who has served as Grounds and Beach Chairman during the past year.
